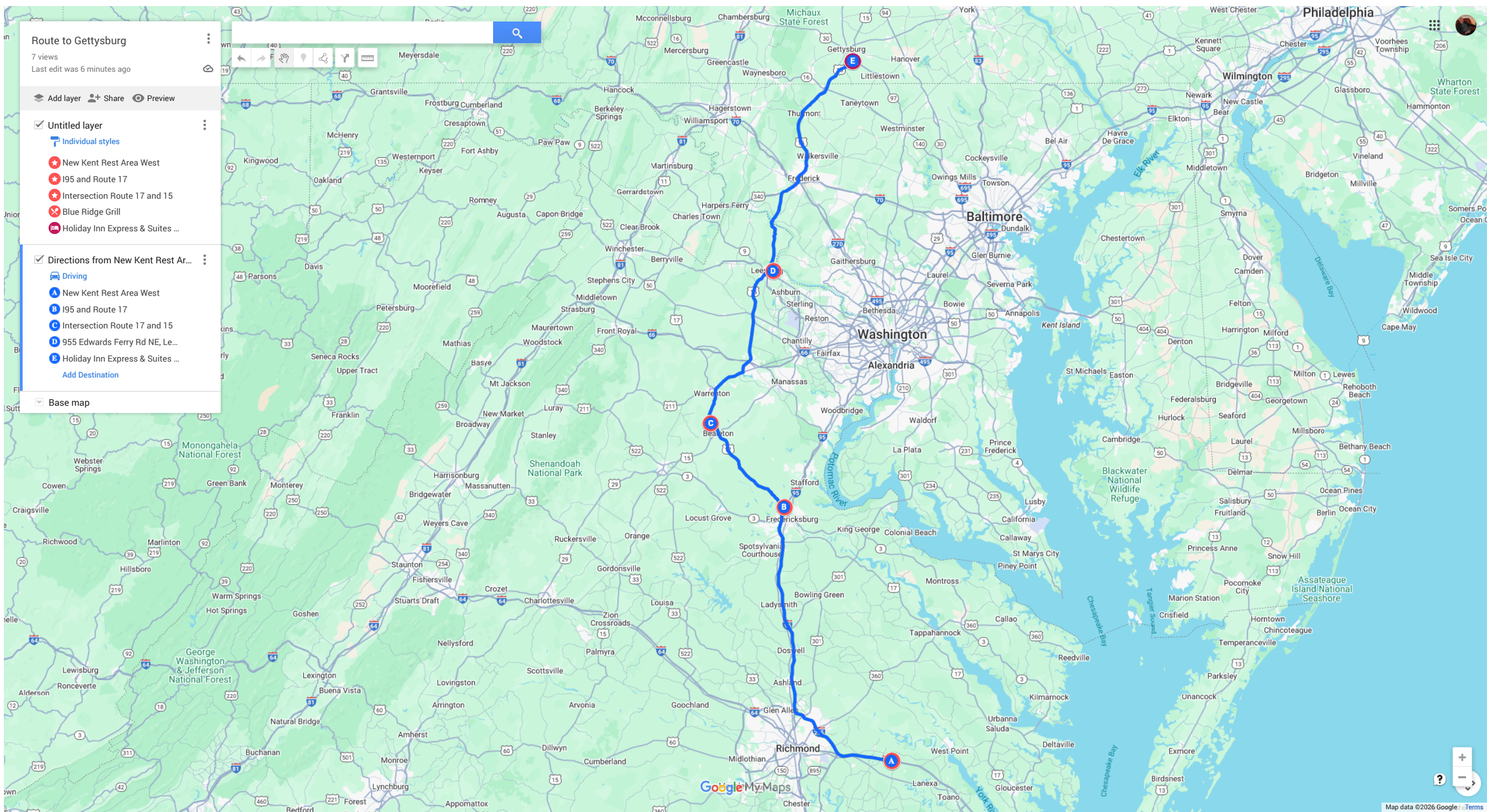

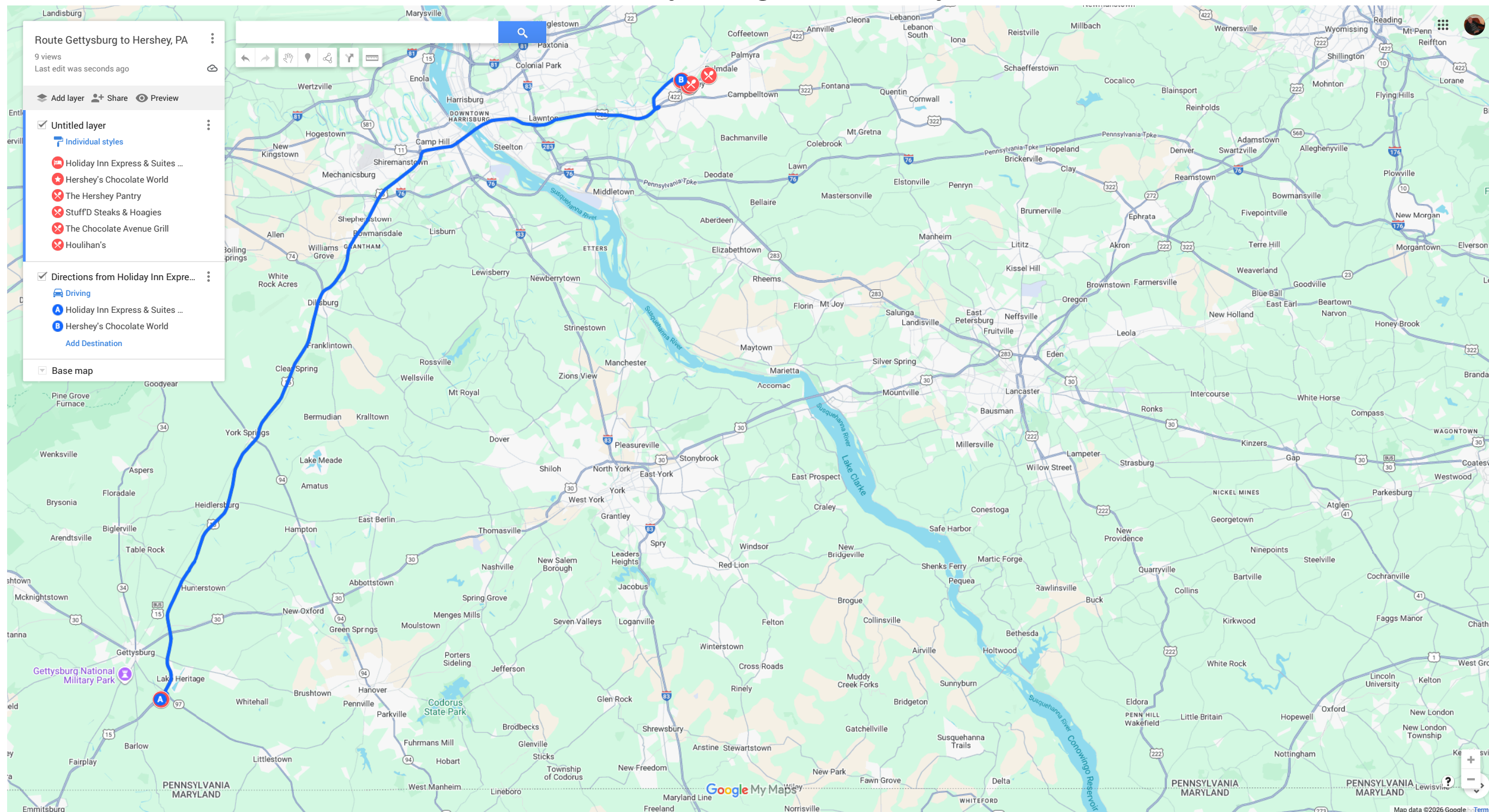

Hershey Chocolate World

You can visit Hershey's Chocolate World in Hershey, PA, and take a free ride-through "factory tour" style attraction that shows how chocolate is made from bean to bar.

Key details

- The attraction is located at 101 Chocolate World Way, Hershey, PA 17033.
- The ride is approximately 30 minutes long, is wheelchair accessible, and runs continuously during open hours.
- At the end of the ride you'll receive a complimentary product sample.
- Important: It is not a behind-the-scenes production factory tour of the actual manufacturing line of the Hershey's company. The real factory operations are not open to the general public for full tours.

Good to know / Tips

- Since the ride is free, it's a great first stop if you're visiting Hershey but don't want to pay for full amusement-park entry.
- Crowd tip: It tends to get busy during peak hours (especially weekends/holidays). Going early or later in the day may reduce wait time.
- Parking: Many visitors note that the Chocolate World facility is separate from the main amusement-park admission gate of Hershey park — you can visit without paying for park admission.
- If you're interested in more immersive experiences, they also offer paid add-ons like making your own candy bar, chocolate tasting sessions, trolley history tours of the town.
- The attraction is open year-round.
- Typical hours shown: 9 :00 AM until around 10 :00 PM (varies by day) for the general facility.
- For example: According to one listing: Mon–Thu ~9 :00 AM-5 :00 PM, Fri ~9 :00 AM-10 :00 PM, Sat ~9 :00 AM-11 :00 PM, Sun ~9 :00 AM-9 :00 PM.
- Note: "Tours run continuously during operating hours" for the free ride.

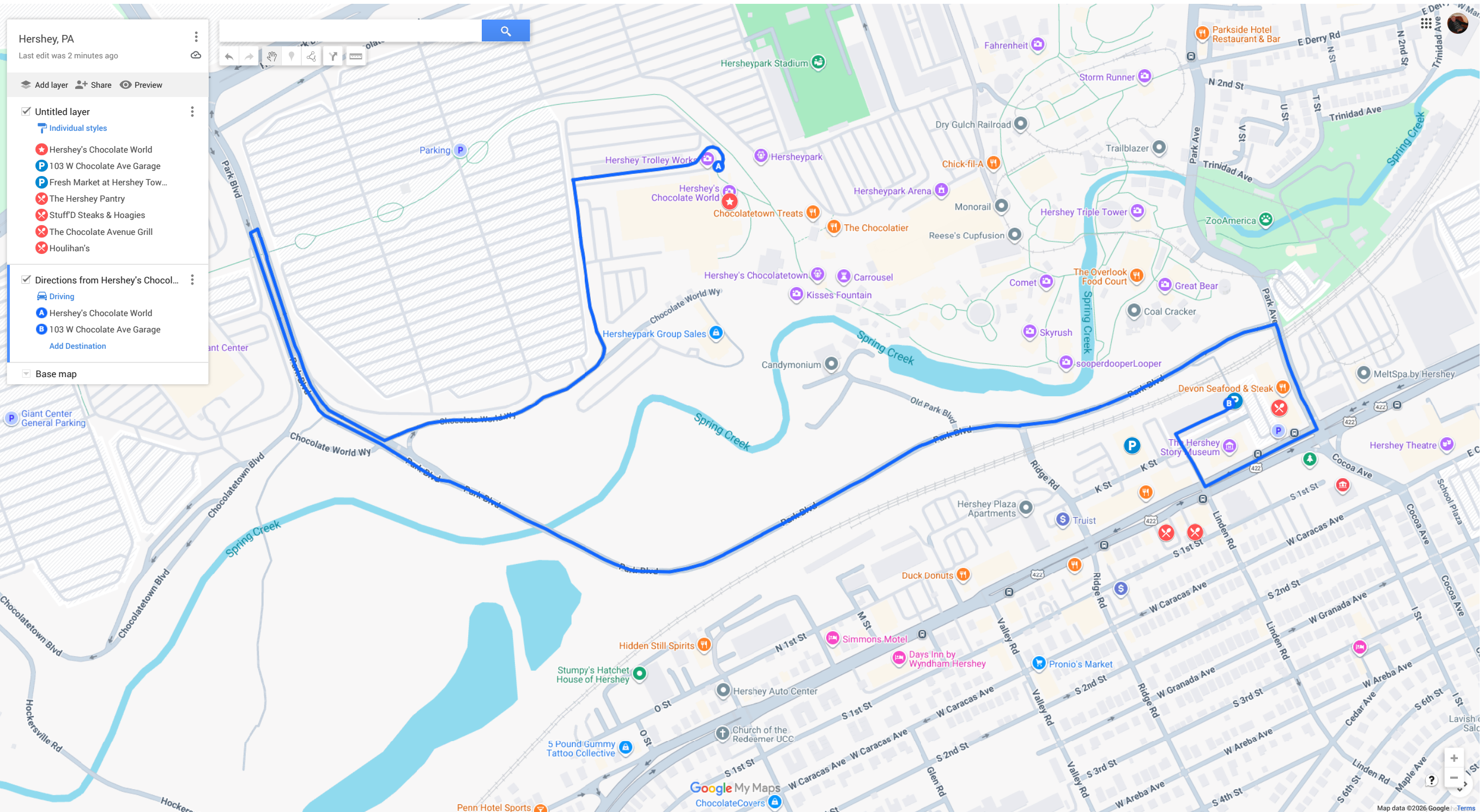
Booking & Ticketed Experiences

- The free "Chocolate Tour Ride" (a ride-through attraction) does not require advance purchase. It runs continuously during open hours.
- For the paid experiences (e.g., "Create Your Own Candy Bar", "Hershey's Unwrapped", "Hershey's Great Candy Expedition", etc.), it is strongly recommended to book in advance online because availability is limited, especially on weekends/holidays.
- Example bundle details: Online ticket bundles include free parking and several attractions at a discount.

Tips for Your Visit

- If you just want the free ride, you can walk in early or later in the day when crowds are lighter. The site suggests the best times are the first or last two hours of the day.
- Parking is free for the first 3 hours (and free all day if you purchase one of the attraction tickets).
- If you plan to do a paid experience, book ahead to guarantee a spot and often secure a better price.
- Double-check the specific hours on the day of your visit as hours can vary by season or special events. The official site states "hours are subject to change."

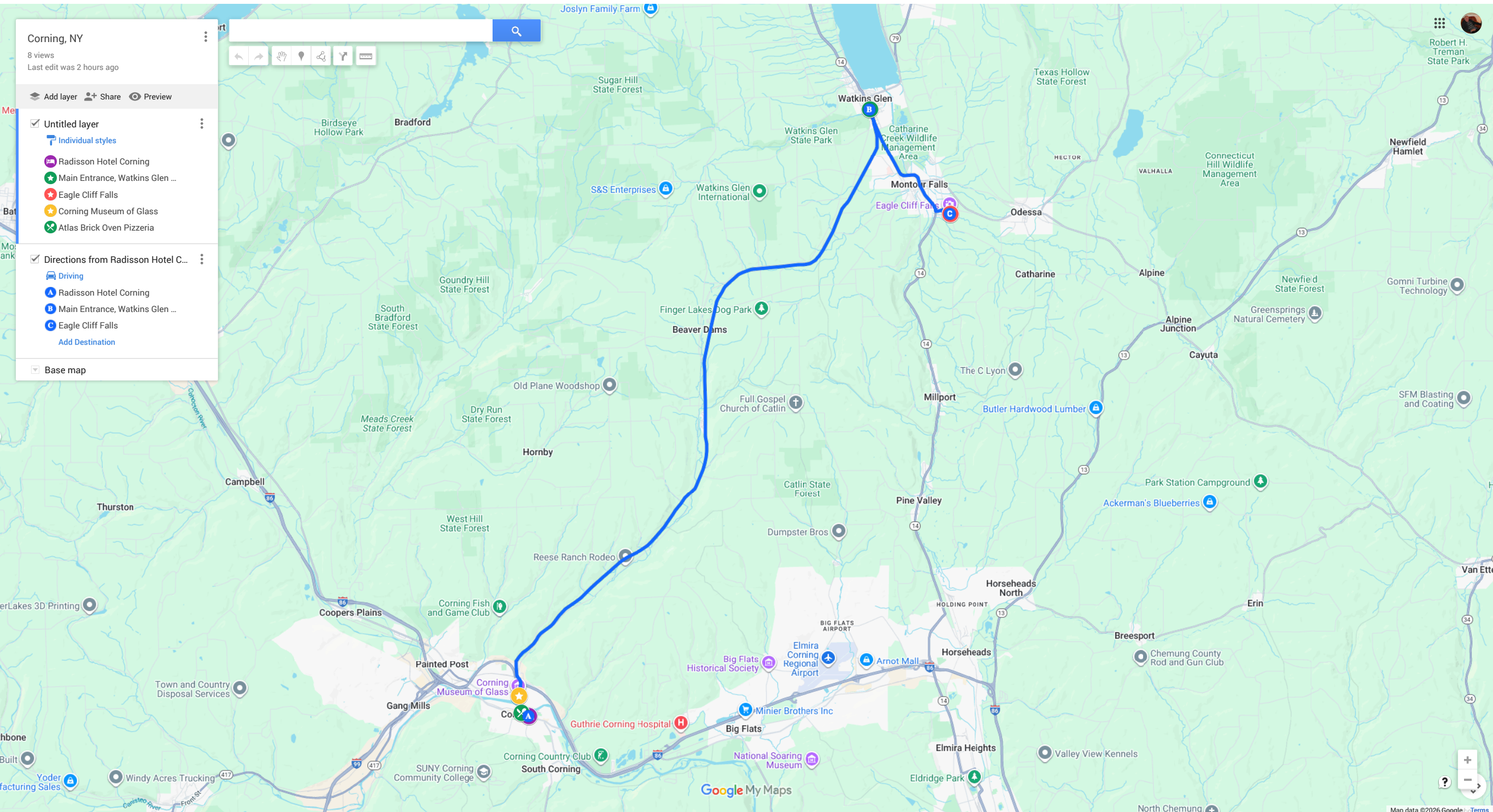

Corning, NY

Short drive to Watkins Glen and hike the beautiful Gorge Trail and or drop by the famous race track.

Gorge Trail Details

- Length:
The Gorge Trail is approximately 1.5 miles one-way, so expect around 3 miles in total if you hike out and back.
- Elevation Gain & Features:
The trail includes over 800 stone steps and climbs roughly 400–500 feet through the narrow gorge. Along the way, you’ll encounter 19 waterfalls, dramatic cliffs, carved tunnels, and scenic bridges.

Typical Hiking Time

- Most visitors spend around 2 hours completing the out-and-back trek — but that assumes a steady pace with stops.
- If you plan to linger for photos or soak in the sights, giving yourself 2–3 hours is a good idea.

✔ What makes mid-September a great time

- The trail is open in that period: the Gorge Trail typically opens in mid- to late May and remains open through late October (weather permitting).
- In mid-September you’ll often get cooler, comfortable temperatures (often in the 70s °F) and fewer crowds compared to peak summer months.
- The early fall foliage is beginning to show which adds beautiful color contrast to the waterfalls and gorge walls. Many guides highlight this as a “sweet spot” for combining waterfall views + early autumn color.
- The waterfalls and gorge features are still quite dramatic at this time: the water flow may be slightly less than peak spring melt, but still very strong, especially if there’s been recent rainfall.

⚠ Things to watch / prepare for

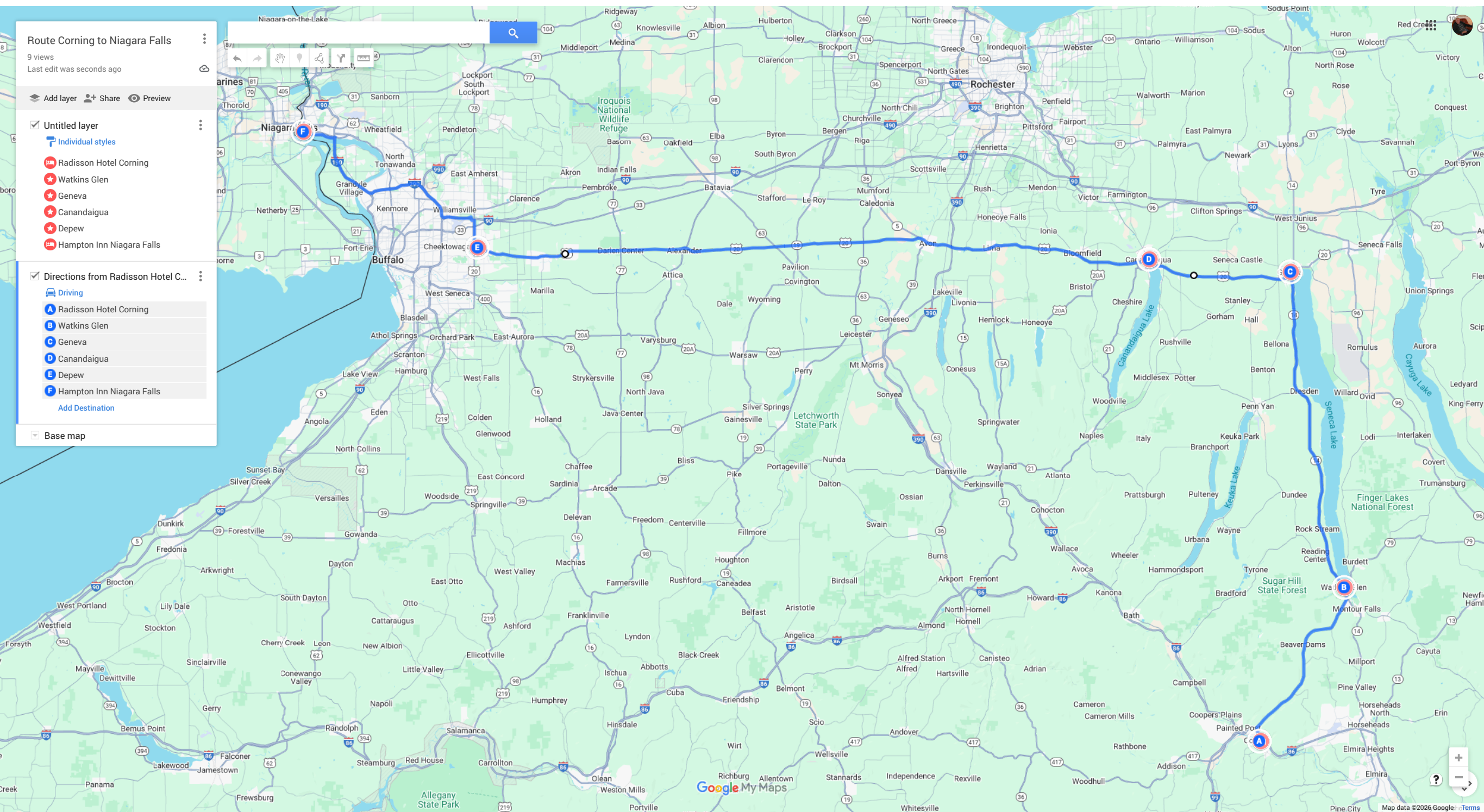
- Wet / slippery conditions: The trail has many stone stairs and wet surfaces from spray/mist. Proper shoes with good traction are important.
- Crowds: While mid-September is better than peak July/August, it can still get busy (especially weekends). To avoid congestion, try to go early in the day.
- Trail end of season: Even though mid-September is safe, note that later autumn the trail may close due to ice/falling rock risk. It’s wise to check current status before you go.
- Elevations/stairs: The trail includes an elevation gain (around 500 ft) and many stairs (hundreds), so it’s moderately rigorous.
- Weather variation: Mornings may be cooler, the gorge can feel damp and cooler due to shade and mist. A light layer might be helpful.

🎒 Practical recommendations for your visit

- Wear sturdy shoes with good grip — avoid sandals or shoes without traction.
- Bring a light jacket or layer (especially for early morning).
- Start early (morning) to avoid the bulk of the crowds.
- Allow enough time — the trail is around 1.5 miles one-way (so ~3 miles round trip if you return by same route) plus time for stops/photos.
- Stay on the marked path — the gorge has steep drops and slippery spots.
- Check the park’s website or call in advance to confirm the trail is open (especially if weather has been unusual).

 Part of Day 1 and all of Day 2 – The Classic Niagara Experience

Morning – Get right up close

Niagara Falls State Park (the oldest state park in the U.S.) is your base for the day — everything below is within walking distance.

1. Start at the Observation Tower
 - The only place on the U.S. side where you can see all three waterfalls (American, Bridal Veil, and Horseshoe).
 - Great for panoramic photos in the morning light.
2. Ride the Elevator down to the Maid of the Mist dock
 - Board the Maid of the Mist boat — it takes you right into the mist at the base of Horseshoe Falls.
 - You'll get wet (ponchos provided), but it's an unforgettable, powerful experience.

Afternoon – Walk Goat Island

1. Cross to Goat Island (easy on foot — just follow the signs).
 - Stop at Luna Island and Terrapin Point for up-close views of the Falls.
2. Cave of the Winds Don a poncho and sandals (provided) and walk the wooden platforms right beside Bridal Veil Falls — you'll feel the spray and thunder!
3. Grab lunch nearby:
 - Top of the Falls Restaurant (seasonal, usually open spring–fall) offers a great view.
 - Or, picnic on Goat Island with views of Horseshoe Falls.

Evening – Relax and enjoy the lights

1. Walk to Prospect Point or Terrapin Point at sunset — the colors are incredible.
2. Stay for the Falls Illumination (nightly starting at dusk).
 - Lights change color, and in summer, there's often a fireworks show (check the schedule).



Tips

- Everything in Niagara Falls State Park is walkable; you don't need to move your car much once parked.
- Bring waterproof shoes or sandals for Cave of the Winds.
- For fewer crowds, visit the park early morning or around sunset.

Scenic Drive from Niagara Falls, NY to Wellsboro, PA

 1. Niagara Falls → Letchworth State Park (North Entrance)

Route:
Niagara Falls → I-190 S → I-90 E (New York Thruway) → Exit 48 (Batavia) → NY-63 S → NY-36 S → Mt Morris → Letchworth North Entrance

 Drive time: ~2 hours

-  Good stop:
- Coffee Press Café, 13 Jackson St, Batavia — great espresso and pastries.
 - Fuel/top off in Mount Morris before entering the park.

 2. Letchworth State Park (Enter at Mount Morris)


You'll follow Park Road all the way south through the park (~20 miles of scenic driving). Allow 2–3 hours with stops.


 Key Scenic Stops (North → South)

1. Mount Morris Dam Overlook – sweeping views of the Genesee River gorge.
2. Tea Table Overlook – first big glimpse of “The Grand Canyon of the East.”
3. Inspiration Point – best view of Upper & Middle Falls; photo stop a must.
4. Upper Falls + Portage Viaduct Bridge – one of the most photographed spots in upstate NY.
- Optional: short walk to the bridge viewpoint.
5. Middle Falls – park’s signature waterfall, viewable from a short loop trail.
6. Lower Falls & Footbridge – short hike (15–20 min RT) to a quieter waterfall.
7. Great Bend Overlook – last big canyon view before exiting the park.


-  Lunch stop:
- Glen Iris Inn Restaurant (near Middle Falls) – scenic terrace dining overlooking the falls.


(Open seasonally, usually Apr–Oct. If closed, grab sandwiches from the nearby park concession or Mount Morris Diner before entering.)

 Time estimate: Enter around 11 AM → exit south around 2:30–3 PM.

 3. Letchworth South Exit → Wellsboro, PA

Route:
Exit at Portageville/Castile, then:
NY-19 S → NY-243 E → NY-19 S (again) → cross into Pennsylvania → PA-49 E → Wellsboro

 Drive time: ~2.5 hours

 Scenic & Rest Stops

- Cuba, NY – quaint downtown and a great local cheese shop:

 Cuba Cheese Shoppe (53 Genesee St).

- Gold, PA Overlook (near Ulysses) – panoramic views of northern PA’s wooded hills.

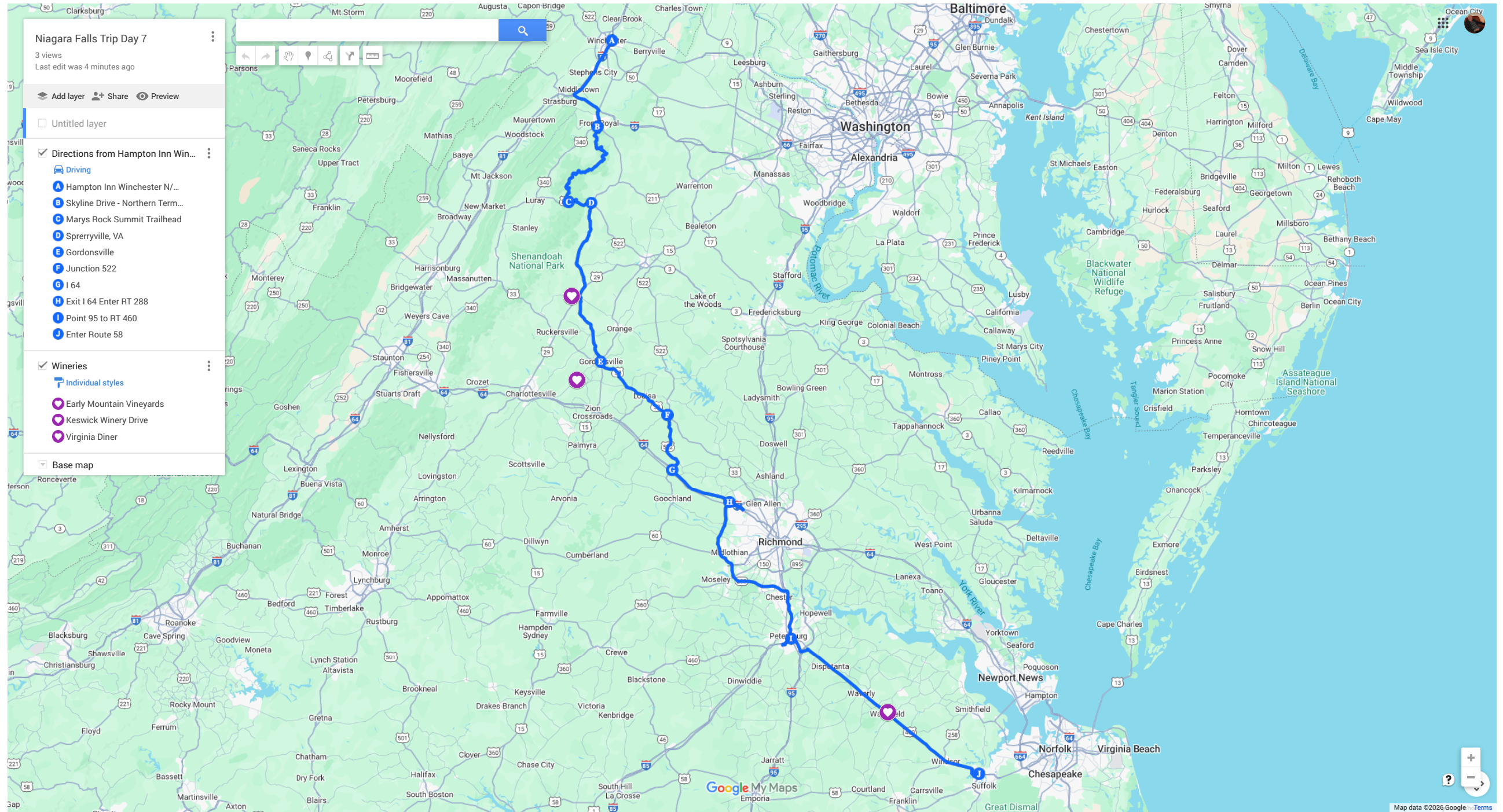


Winchester to Home
